Join us for an exciting Fundraising Evening at SMR, Snow Mountain River Flagstaff, to support our new documentary, **Jaguar Warrior, Jaguar Protector**. Your contributions will help raise awareness about the jaguars, how to protect an ecosystem around it, and future impacts from the Border Wall.

Jaguar Warrior, Jaguar Protector: Our 3.5 min. trailer explores the urgent mission to save the endangered northernmost population of jaguars, from Mexico to the American Southwest. We collaborate with wildlife scientists and advocates to address this crisis, amplifying Native American voices supporting the reintroduction of jaguars to their ancestral lands. Location shooting has taken us to the Sonoran Mexican Jaguar Reserve, the Sky Islands of Arizona and the U.S.- Mexico Border Wall. Through this film, we aim to highlight the jaguars fragile future and the dedicated individuals working to save them.

Anna, Emma, and the California Condors: In a world facing climate change, sisters Anna and Emma team up with California Condors to create a better future. Guided by their father, Chris Parish, director of the Peregrine Fund, and their mother, Ellen Parish, a dedicated environmental teacher, they work to save these magnificent birds from extinction. "The Right to Be Wild" is an inspiring story of hope and resilience, following the journey of the endangered Mexican Gray Wolf. As the most threatened gray wolf subspecies, their struggle for survival highlights the challenges faced in nature.
